

Anke Hassel is the Academic Director of the [Institute of Economic and Social Research](#) (WSI) of the Hans Böckler Foundation. She is also Professor of Public Policy at the [Hertie School of Governance](#) in Berlin (on leave) and faculty member of the [Berlin Graduate School for Transnational Studies](#). From 2009 until 2012 Anke was Senior Visiting Fellow at the European Institute of the London School of Economics. She studied political science, economics and law in Bonn and at the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE). In 1996, Anke joined the Max Planck Institute for the Study of Societies in Cologne, obtained her Phd in 1998 and completed her postdoctoral lecture qualification in 2003.

She was a visiting scholar at the Social Science Research Center Berlin (WZB) and King's College, Cambridge, UK. In 2003/2004, Anke worked for the Planning Department of the Federal Ministry of Economics and Labour (BMWA) and then joined the Jacobs University Bremen as Professor of Sociology. She received Fellowships from the Alexander von Humboldt Stiftung, Volkswagen Stiftung, Friedrich Ebert Stiftung and Hans Böckler Stiftung. In 2012/13, she served as an Expert Member of the [Enquete Commission of the German Federal Parliament on "Growth, Wealth, Quality of Life"](#).

Her research interest focuses on the interplay between modern business and social systems including the institutional foundations of business systems, labour rights and corporate social responsibility. She has written extensively about the transformation of the German political economy in a comparative perspective and the role of labour market institutions in the Eurozone.
