WSI reports appear at regular intervals and analyse collective bargaining policy and wage trends in Germany and Europe as well as distribution of social wealth in Germany.

Research reports present up-to-date findings from empirical research, data analyses and surveys of the current state of research.

Practice-based findings present reports and assessments of current policy and trade union developments by academics and practitioners.

Debate offers a forum for discussion of controversial scholarly or political issues.

Book reviews introduce new publications in the fields of social and economic sciences.

The editors welcome submissions of manuscripts.
